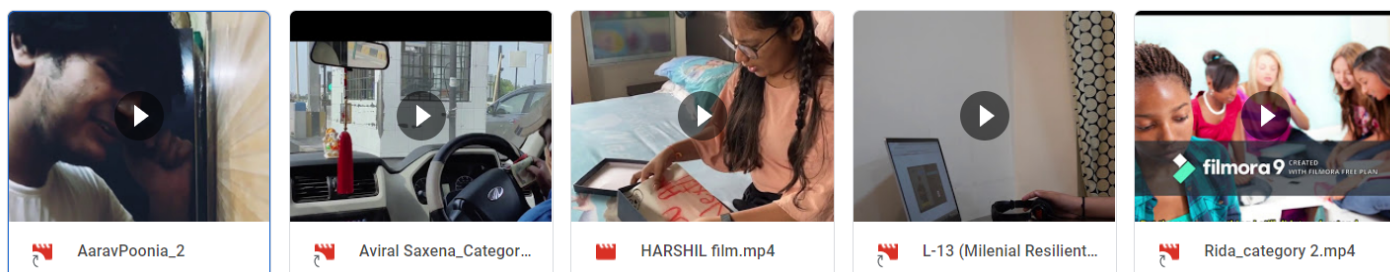

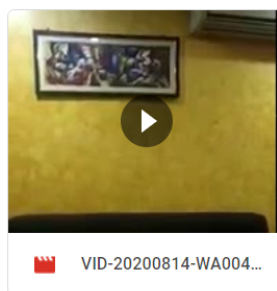
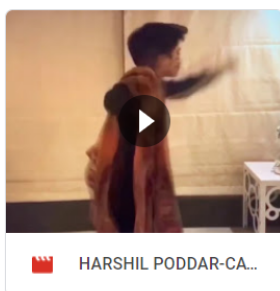


# FOOTLOOSE (DANCE)

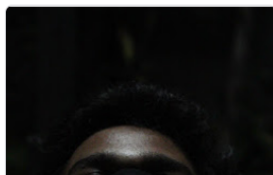
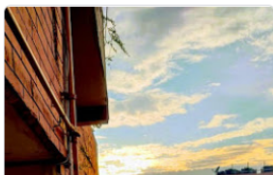
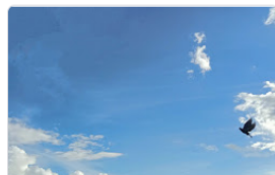
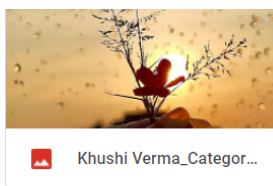
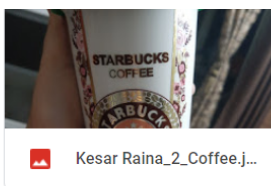
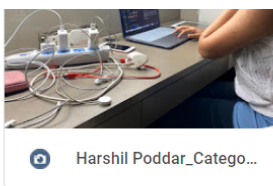
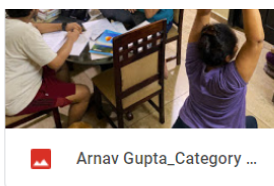
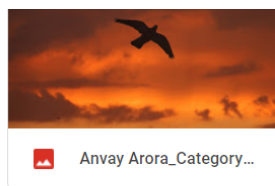


# PICTURE PERFECT (PHOTOGRAPHY)

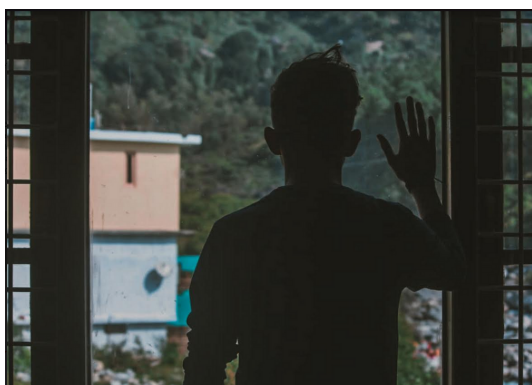

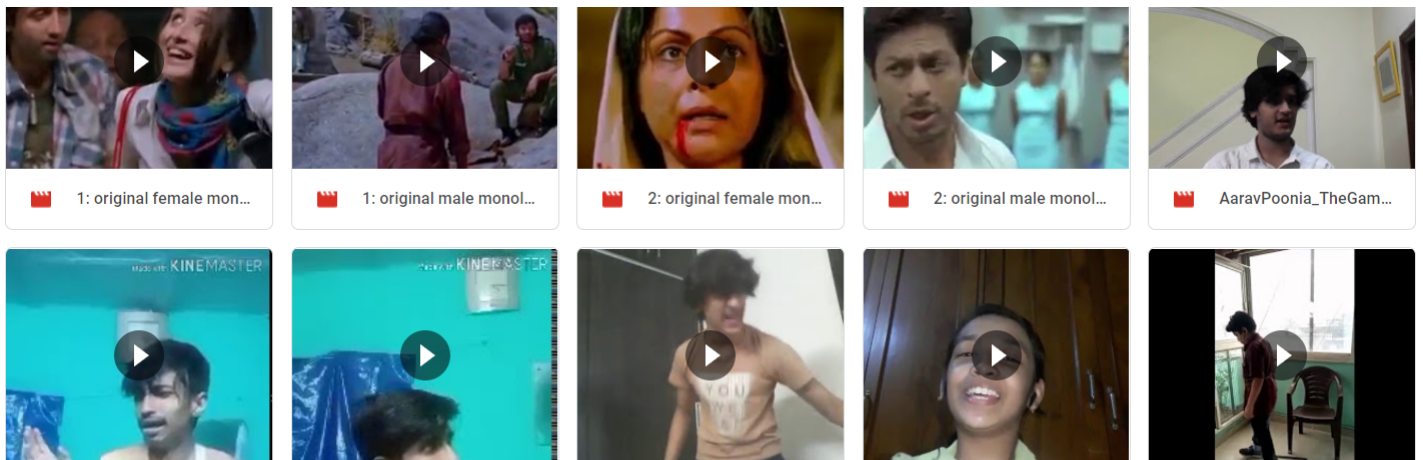

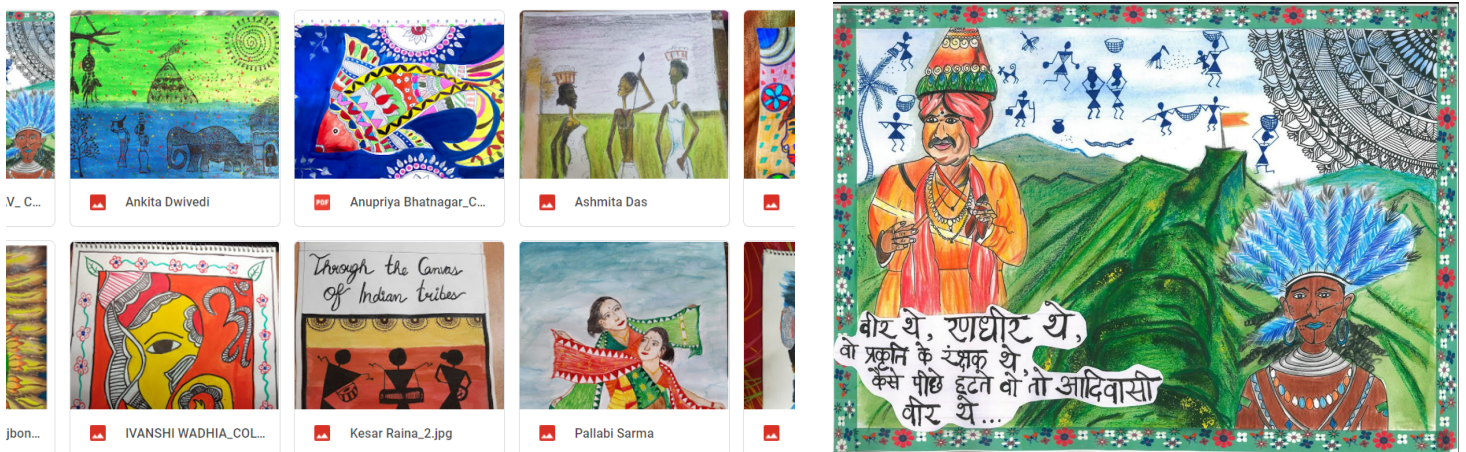


# COLOUR-O-MANIA (DRAWING & PAINTING)

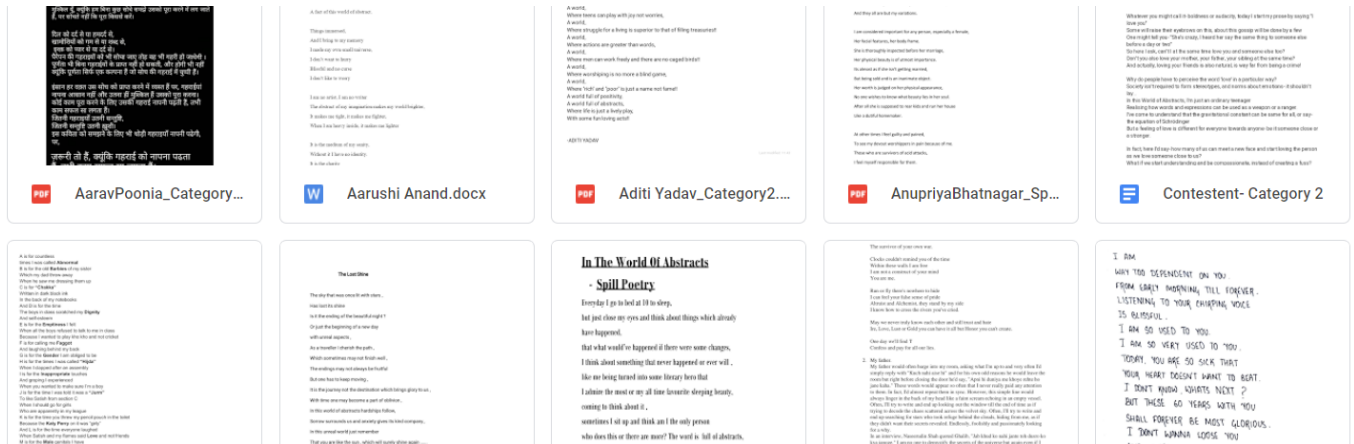

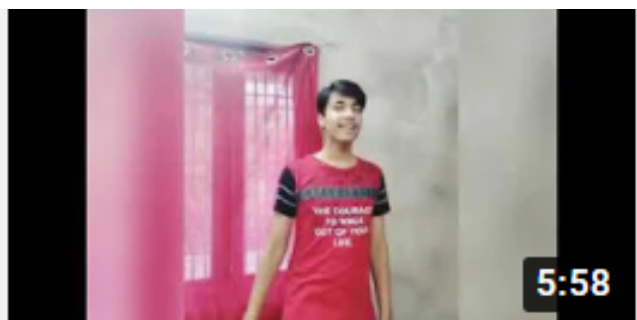
# COMEDY BRUNCH (STAND-UP COMEDY)

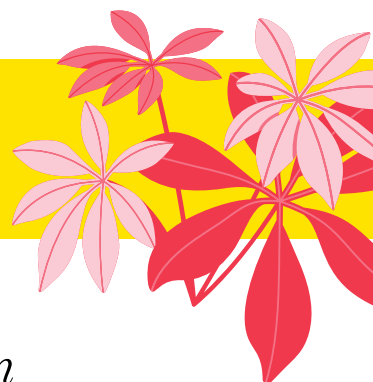
## WITS ON WAR (LIVE DEBATE)

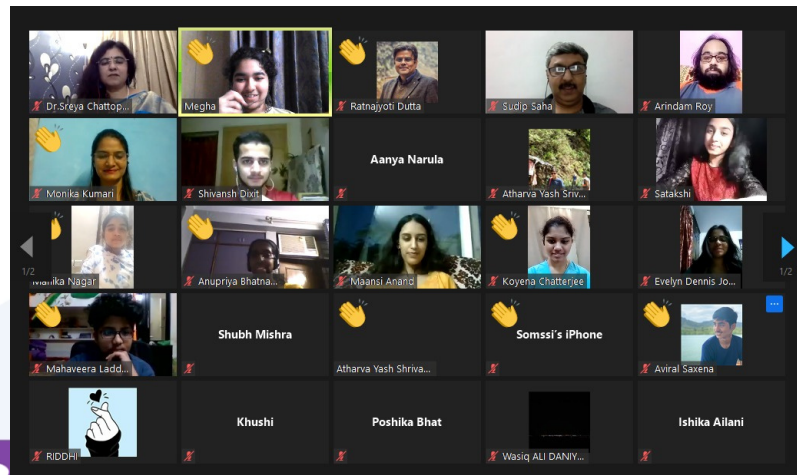
